- The candidate must submit a resumé listing their professional and academic experience.
- The candidate must submit a transcript from their current school. First-year college students, graduate students, or individuals who have recently transferred schools may submit an unofficial transcript from their current school and the most recent official transcript from their prior school.
- High school students must also submit proof of acceptance to their college or university. **Deadline: October 31, 2023**

Adoption STAR Academic Scholarship Program
